Southern Teachers is assisting The Lovett School as it seeks a Director of Civic and Global Engagement to oversee, develop, evaluate, and promote global education programs and initiatives and to develop and execute an overall strategy which guides the school's students, teachers, and families as they engage in service to the local community.

The Director of Civic and Global Engagement will develop and manage an intentional, K-12 approach to global engagement and international travel; articulate a vision and plan for integrating an appreciation for multiple perspectives and global understanding more deeply into the curriculum; further refine and execute existing risk management policies and stay abreast of risk concerns; provide coordinated oversight of international travel opportunities, including planning support to trip leaders; effectively promote student participation in international travel and hosting of international students; manage all aspects of short-term exchanges and the semester school process; serve as the faculty sponsor for the Global Studies Diploma Distinction; develop relationships that result in additional opportunities for students to engage globally; and serve as Principal Designated School Official (PDSO) for SEVIS certification. In addition, he or she will develop and manage an intentional, K-12 approach to service and service learning; cultivate and maintain relationships with a range of community members to identify opportunities for students to engage meaningfully at the local level; deepen key partnerships, ensuring that these relationships are sustainable and mutually beneficial; guide and support students, teachers, and parents who are seeking volunteer or other external engagement opportunities; support the junior internship program; plan and execute the Service Initiation for Ninth Graders (SING); and share Lovett's story of civic and global engagement internally and in the broader community.

The ideal candidate will have a master's degree in education or an applicable field; strategic vision; demonstrated project management skills; experience leading students on international experiential programs; demonstrated ability to connect authentically and work effectively with all students; experience designing curriculum, instruction, and assessment in order to reach a diverse community of learners; excellent written and oral communication skills; a strong desire to work collaboratively, employing a growth mindset and participating in ongoing professional development; and a commitment to developing one's own cultural self-awareness, cultural competence, and emotional intelligence.

Lovett enrolls nearly 1,680 students in grades kindergarten through twelve, from ten counties in the metropolitan Atlanta area. Approximately 21 percent of Lovett's students are students of color. The school offers experiences that inspire students to love learning, encouraging them to think critically, communicate effectively, engage creatively, and collaborate purposefully. Lovett provides opportunities and resources that help students develop independence and self-direction and extend their learning beyond the walls of the classroom as they grow intellectually, emotionally, physically, aesthetically, morally, and spiritually.
