This position will work closely with the Head of School, division heads, and Directors of Curriculum and Instruction.

The Chief Academic Officer will coordinate curriculum and pedagogical practices among the three divisions in the school (K-5, 6-8, and 9-12) and research, promote, and help implement best educational practices. He or she will supervise and evaluate faculty; manage the hiring process of all faculty and staff positions; provide meaningful professional development opportunities, and lead the accreditation process with ISAS and SAES.

The ideal candidate will have at least a master's degree and prior leadership experience in an independent school setting; a mindset of servant leadership; a willingness to tackle complex problems; a desire to learn; and an appreciation for the school's Episcopal identity. He or she will also have excellent communication skills; sharp attention to detail; and a positive attitude.

Established in 1952, St. Andrew's is a co-educational Episcopal day school, enrolling approximately 950 students in grades kindergarten through twelve on two campuses in Austin, Texas. The school strives to help young people from diverse racial, religious, ethnic, and socioeconomic backgrounds to achieve their potential not only in intellectual understanding but also in aesthetic sensitivity, physical well-being, and moral decisiveness so that they may lead productive, responsible lives, not only for themselves but also for their community.
